

THE QUESTION:

"Shall the Board of Education of the Moriarty -Edgewood School District No. 8, Counties of Torrance, Bernalillo, and Santa Fe, New Mexico, be authorized to impose a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of the property allocated to such District under the Property Tax Code for the six (6) years?" (Inclusive of property years 2009-2014)

2 Mill Levy funds are to be used for the maintenance of buildings, acquisition of equipment, and other capital improvement purposes. *Money from this levy may not be used for salaries or related personnel expenses.*

The continuation of the tax is expected to produce approximately \$930,000 per year and matched with approximately \$35,000 per year from the State of New Mexico Public School Capital Improvement Fund.

A vote for the capital improvements tax levy *will not result in a tax increase*. It will authorize a continuation of a levy already in effect and will run for a period of six (6) years.
